DISCUSSION:

Looming teacher strike notice for October 6, 2025; there will be no meetings in a labour dispute School Council is the voice for kids and parents. Principal David has roles in three places - principal, member of council and a member of union. Teachers will withdraw their services (i.e. Google classroom, and D2L). David advised parents to always refer to the labour action page for most up to date information.

5. Administration Report:

School Development Plan , we gathered some student well being data September was getting to know students, building communication and strength in community Full data set from last year, four different pools (i.e. resilience) improvements over the years, up to 70% in most categories

796 students is our population which is a healthy number; less crowding in the halls 28% EAL (LP1 - 40% of those are new language learners, basic functional English) 21% special needs IPP 5% Indigenous 28 - 30 per class 41.4 teachers

44 support staff (7 of whom are the office staff, attendance, secretary, Bridges, Lead, Library, Teach etc)

- Not a lot of support
- October numbers will determine if Mr. Pugh can hire one more EA
- Keep our student services teacher
- Some literacy experts have a time for targeted support

What contributed to this drop?

- Break point alternative setting in grade 7
- New to Canada temp visas, changed at federal level
- Potential returning to their countries origin (uncertainties) speculation
- Mr. P moved to FEO, staffing policies, CBE staffing
- Behaviour support worker moved onto new school

Celebrations at Vincent Massey; lots of positives

- Terry Fox building community and raising money, Rusty puts his heart and soul into the first couple of weeks
- Indigenous Learning activities, Sept 30 we had initiatives leading up to that
- Riverwatch, hopefully council votes in to support us retroactively Grade 9s this year, learning together outside, Environment Chemistry outcomes
- Cross country, wrapped up, bball and soccer were ongoing but suspended when we return they may not happen

Mr Cull spoke about the Indigenous Art Project (a bit of review and update)

- Mural Where the Buffalo Run Down the Hill
- VM on sacred territory, significant land (Edworthy, river valley coming out of foothills, Shagganappi, into downtown, were gathering areas) we want to share our work with students, teachers and parents.
- Knowledge keeper Anita Crosshoe, a school teacher, Piikani Nation, Chickidee clan, BA in Science, and we're in our second year working with her.
- Once labour action is done, she is excited to work with us
- Her TIPI raising build confidence and capacity in our indigenous students Gr. 9 transitioning to high school, tying back into their stories, their culture
- Looked at the historical stories about the land, the power of themselves
- She shared the lens of the female role in the TIPI
- She makes it safe to ask questions, and brings joy a real gift
- Warm wall east gym was the idea for provocation about art , spectacle to see, this inspired Meghan to initiate this project, with Mr. Cull
- Understanding land and public art
- Artist will be Kalum Teke Dan, Blood Tribe Southern Alberta, indigenous artist, showed beautiful murals by him, his work is incredible, large YYC installations
- The project will take into consideration student ideas
- Plan through the winter and by Spring they'll have a plan

Funding \$20,000

Lifts and incidentals, \$5,000 - \$10,000 (painted on board, so installation, CBE facilities) Asking for \$15,000

They have been applying for grants (i.e Clty of Calgary, has gone in!!)

Alberta Arts Grant, 2026 submissions

Student voice about the painting, not just hiring the artist for TRC action items, central to this work is the ripple effect, education about Indigenous peoples' experiences and reconciliation (i.e. sharing circles led by Grade 8s who were participants in the nature walk to White Oak Park last month). VM Staff has taken this on whole heartedly.
